



SHOW APPROVAL PROCESS

Reservation of a Show Date/Location: To reserve a show date/location, a written request must be submitted to NAPHA at least 5 months prior to the show. The reservation remains pending until final show approval is granted and payment of the appropriate fee (if required) is complete. Clubs or shows should not advertise approval until the approval is confirmed and appropriate fees have been paid. Premiums should not be printed prior to approval.

Application for Approval: To receive NAPHA approval, show management needs to submit an application for each show date to the NAPHA office with a complete and final class list and any requests for rule exceptions at least 120 days prior to the event. If the application is in accordance with NAPHA rules and fees have been paid, show management will be notified and the approved show date/location/contact will be posted on the NAPHA website. Shows approved before March 1st will be published in NAPHA's Annual Membership Directory.

Types of Shows & Approval Fees:

- "L" – Local Show. A non-championship show, i.e. playdays, schooling shows, one-day shows sponsored by a Peruvian Horse Club or organization. No charge. Request for show date/approval must be obtained 2 months in advance.
- "AB" – All Breed Show. A non-championship, i.e. playdays, schooling shows, one-day shows, containing classes of breeds other than Peruvian Horses. No Charge. Request for show date/approval must be obtained 2 months in advance.
- "ABC" – All Breed Championship Show. ABC shows must contain classes for breeds other than Peruvian Horses. The approval fee is \$200 plus \$1 per horse over 100. Late approval fee between 60 and 119 days is \$250 and under 60 days is \$300.
- "APP" – All Peruvian Horse Championship Show. The approval fee is \$500. Late approval fee between 60 and 119 days is \$550 and under 60 days is \$600.

Show Zones & Approval: Unless an exception is granted, no more than one show will be approved on the same date within the same zone. Exceptions are:

- In the case of California where no two shows within 300 miles of each other in the same zone will be approved for the same date(s);
- When two or more shows in the same zone agree to having the same date;
- When the Board of Directors issues an exception for two or more shows requesting the same dates within the same zone.

Zone 1 – AK, WA, HI OR, MT, ID, WY, UT, Northern NV, Northern CA, BC-ALTA-SASK (CANADA)

Zone 2 – Southern CA, AZ, Southern NV

Zone 3 – MN, IA, MO, AR, ND, SD, NE, KS, CO, NM, OK, TX, LA, MANITOBA (CANADA)

Zone 4 – MS, TN, KY, IL, WI, MI, IN, OH, AL, GA, FL, SC, NC, VA, WV, PA, MD, DE, NJ, CT, RI, MA, NY, VT, NH, ME, ONT-QUE-NF-NB (CANADA)

Premium List & Publicity: Production and distribution of the Show Premium List (including a copy sent to the NAPHA office) and all show publicity is the responsibility of show management. It is imperative that NAPHA be included in the Responsibility/Liability section of the Premium List and Entry Form.

Judge Selection: NAPHA encourages each show to obtain a written agreement with its judge. It is advisable to send a written invitation and contract to the judge via certified return-receipt mail with a request that the judge respond within a specified time. The show will then know the judge has received the invitation/contract and, if necessary, will have time to select another judge.

Online Show Management: Upon receipt of the class listings, NAPHA will input the initial show set up online at www.hordestudbook.com (also linked to the individual show posting on www.napha.net.) The show set up will allow show management to input entries and maintain the show results online (note: if the internet is not available at the show location a stand-alone program will be provided for the show secretary.) Show results are available online at point of final input.

For Show Points: Shows held in the United States must use NAPHA rules to be approved for points. Shows held outside the U.S. requesting approval and not using NAPHA rules must receive approval from the NAPHA Board of Directors.

Important: Only horses with NAPHA, PPHRNA, AAOBPPH and Canadian registration papers will be allowed to participate in NAPHA approved shows. NAPHA cannot grant approval or points to any show that also receives approval from any other U.S. Peruvian Horse entity. Acceptance of horses with any other registration papers or approval from another U.S. Peruvian Horse organization will automatically negate the NAPHA approval and the show approval fee will be forfeited.

As fulfillment for show approval and points, the following information needs to be provided to the NAPHA office within 30 days following the show. Failure to supply any of these reports may result in suspension of the show...

- Copies of all Drug Declarations submitted to the show office. If the show is to receive extra points for being declared “drug free,” copies of the reports from the testing lab must be sent to NAPHA.
- Show Management Report
- Steward’s Report
- Judge’s Report
- Any Amateur Declaration Forms filed at the Show
- Veterinarian’s Report forms filed at the Show
- Copies of Exhibitor Report Cards – if used
- Report on Violations – if any

Extra Points: A show can receive up to 150% more points

50% Additional Points For a “Drug Free Show,” the following requirements must be met:

- Management of shows held in states (i.e. California) which have state drugging laws and testing procedures must submit copies of their filing with the state as well as a copy of a letter specifically requesting drug testers to be present. These must accompany the approval application. If a copy of the show filing and a letter are not received by NAPHA, no extra points will be given.
- Options for shows in states without such programs:
 1. Request testing equipment for a minimum of 5 horses through NAPHA. Drug lab used is Truesdail.
 2. Include a contract with a credible testing lab in the show approval application.

For both options, copies of the lab results for at least 5 horses tested at each show must be sent to NAPHA within 60 days of the close of the show. If NAPHA does not receive the results within 60 days, we will assume drug testing was not done and adjust the show’s points accordingly.
